I am also very happy and grateful that I got the chance to learn Japanese, all of my teachers were amazing and very patient with me. I started the semester with zero

knowledge of the Japanese language so I was behind everybody else in class but thanks to all of my teachers who explained, took the time to answer my question and show me the basics I managed to have a little knowledge of the Japanese language. I definitely do not recommend studying at Ochanomizu University with no knowledge of the Japanese language at all because it is very challenging, not impossible but hard. I do think that if I had the chance to be in Japan, I would have learned more and progressed faster but I do not regret anything, I love learning languages, especially Japanese. It was the first time I had to learn a new alphabet and everything about the Japanese language is so interesting, I will keep on learning the language until someday, I hope, I can finally go and see for myself everything Japan has to offer.
