


Ocha Summer Program for Global Leaders - Subject Based Course

COURSE INFORMATION



Please read the following instructions CAREFULLY:

➤ "Subject Based Course" consists of a LECTURE and a PROJECT WORK (both <u>mandatory</u>) with 4 credits given.

As for LECTURE, choose ONE of the sub courses #1~#3 as listed. You **CANNOT** choose more than one sub-course.

Lecture (taught in English)

Students are allowed to take **ONLY ONE** sub-course from 1 to 3.

1. Natural science: basic questions and applications (Up to 15 students)



Basic research in natural science aims to deepen our understanding of nature from various perspectives. There have been many progress during the last century in mathematics, physics, chemistry and biology which made their ways to applications affecting our daily life, such as mobile phones, various materials and vaccines etc. Also, computing and information science developed rapidly since its invention and by now they are accelerating research in all disciplines. Behind these technological developments are the steady progress in basic science which are driven by researchers desire to answer basic questions in nature. The lectures would offer opportunities to hear about the fundamental questions which are motivating the current research and examples in different areas of science.

2. Gender, Globalization, and Diversity in Contemporary Japan (Up to 20 students)

This course looks at how contemporary Japanese society is changing in the context of both global and domestic social pressures with a special focus on the consequences of these changes for gender and diversity. From social welfare to employment, immigration, gender equity and inclusion, contemporary Japan is facing a range of policy and social issues that will shape Japanese society in the coming decades. How is Japan adapting to our changing world, and what challenges and hurdles remain going forward?

3. Exploring Human Life and Environmental Sciences: Integrating Perspectives on Health, Society, and Technology (Up to 18 students)

This comprehensive program, a collaborative effort of the Human-Environmental Science Department, Human Life Science Department, Nutrition Department, and Psychology Department, delves into various facets of health, society, and technology. Specifically, it examines the relationship between modern lifestyles and health, addressing this issue in light of recent scientific findings in the field of human diet and physical behavior. The exploration extends beyond biological aspects to encompass the influence of social norms, cultural assets, and overall well-being. When relevant, discussions will be enriched with references and data specifically directed to Japanese society and its people, offering participants valuable insights applicable to both global and Japanese perspectives.

AND

Project Work (taught in English)

This class provides an opportunity to learn about one's own culture by comparing the cultural identity cultivated in a country, region, or community with that of other countries, based on educational practices developed in various countries.

In addition, the objective of this class is to cultivate leadership skills to carry out projects in multicultural groups through collaborative learning. In this class, the emphasis will be on interactivity and independence.

Ocha Summer Program for Global Leaders



This program provides intensive courses in summer for students of partner universities from both domestic and overseas, as well as students of Ochanomizu University and Graduate School. All classes are multi-cultural, aiming for students' career development and promotion of international exchanges.

PROGRAM FEES

- Registration fee: 10,000 JPY (non-refundable)
- Tuition fee: Waived for partner's universities
- Registration fee needs to be paid at the time of application to Ochanomizu university and will NOT be refunded.
- Travelling costs to Tokyo, accommodation fee, and living costs (daily meal, transportation from the
 accommodation to Ochanomizu University, etc.) must be paid by students.
- Depending on circumstances, scholarship may be awarded to selected students.

Students who want to participate in the Summer Program must contact to the person in charge at each partner university. The person in charge is required to nominate their candidates through the website.
